11. Whether you permit 'close family members' who do not live with the 'service user' to be employed under (a) CHC and (b) PHB?

(a) No - Where an individual is eligible for CHC care is commissioned from an independent care provider which may be in a residential care placement or with a domiciliary care provider.

(b) Yes - If a PHB is in place for a CHC patient this allows for greater flexibility with care provision and dependant on individual choice for a family member to be appointed as a carer / personal assistant under exceptional circumstances where this is agreed with the CCG as in the patients best interests as part of the support planning process.
